In the extra end, Steve Smith threw <u>an impeccable draw</u> through a tiny port that ended up being the game winner after a failed angle raise. Huge congrats to Team Smith as they will represent the GLCA at the National 5 & Under at the Southern California Curling Center in Los Angeles later in May 2022!


Men's International Recap

2022 marked an historic year for the Detroit Curling Club. The club opened twenty years ago January 4, 2002 at its current home in Ferndale. The opening of the Club coincided with the Men's International Bonspiel, making that the first spiel held at our current home. 2022 also marks the 125th anniversary of the Men's spiel with the first held in 1897. It was a pleasure to again hold this event after having to miss 2021 due to the global pandemic.

The 2022 Men's International was not quite the bonspiel we are used to having. The field of teams, which usually numbers twenty-four, was reduced to sixteen teams. The weeks and days leading up to the event posed many challenges with teams having to withdraw due to potential difficulties with crossing the US-Canada border and positive COVID-19 cases. Detroit, who is limited to six teams in a typical event, numbered nine at the 2022 event. Out-of-town teams numbered seven with only one team representing Canada, the Mike Hardman rink from Bradford Curling Club. The Hardman rink did make it to the A Event finals, but ultimately lost an exciting and difficult match to the Mike Graves rink from Midland Curling Club.

Thanks are owed to many for making this event possible. Nick Yambura coordinated the Detroit Playdowns. Eric Kortebein was first in the club each morning getting the ice ready. Alex Rich stepped up in the final hours and put a team together to play in the event after another team withdrew due to a positive COVID-19 test. Volunteers who helped on both sides of the glass making our ice and warm room fun and inviting. Thank you to all who played a part, big or small, you are very much appreciated.

Rental Equipment Maintenance

There have been regular and consistent comments made about the lack of cleanliness of our ice. Eric does all he can to maintain our ice in pristine condition but he is constantly fighting an uphill battle against the dirt factor. A significant part of the problem lies within the condition of the rental equipment. The grippers are dirty! The rental brooms are growing beards! If the members are so concerned about having clean ice, then do something to help clean up the situation. Make time to pull a box of rental grippers and wash them. The club has water, sinks and cleaning products to make the task easy. The brooms should be aggressively brushed on a regular basis. Dirty brush heads can be rotated to the clean edge too. If the heads are too dirty, there are replacement heads in the storage room. Become part of the solution and quit complaining and expecting someone else to clean up the mess. This is your club. Treat it like it is your second home. If you take care of it, the complaints will stop.


