Message from the President

Dear Members,

What a summer it's been...and continues to be for those of us who aren't quite ready for the inevitable change in season! With only a few weeks remaining to prepare for the 2022–2023 curling season I'd like to take the opportunity to share with you some of the completed, ongoing and future projects upon which we have embarked. Thank you to the volunteer efforts of our Members and Board of Directors. We wouldn't be where we are today without your constant support and team unity.

Rocks/Blades-

Our rocks were sent to Canada Curling Stone to reprofile the comparatively mushy 10-year-old strike bands and repaint the handles damaged from COVID protocol cleaning. They also sharpened 4 of our scraper blades as a part of regular maintenance. The new bands should provide us with much more lively rock action when hitting, and the refurbished handles will no doubt ***sparkle***. Paul Gaines and Dallas Schneider graciously drove them to Canada back in late June. Paul and Beverly Gaines picked them up on September 21 and returned them to the club for reassembly. This personal delivery service saved the club thousands of dollars. Thank you, Paul, Dallas and Bev, for your time! See below for a recap and photos.

Landscaping-

Lee Evans volunteered to take over the landscaping for the club. He worked with Laura Gilchrist and Maryanne Wessels to present a plan to the city to clean up and reorganize the landscaping in the front of the club. Lee reports back that "Stage 1 is complete and for now we look 'tidied' up, and can boast some curb appeal." And he is not wrong! The front of the club looks great with the newly organized plants and fresh mulch! See a current photo below. Lee is working on plans for Stage 2. Arena–

The painting has been completed and it looks fantastic! Last month, the Board of Directors approved funding to hire a contractor to complete the painting project for our ice arena. At the same time, we decided to leave the beams as they are and not paint them. We realized that adding paint to the treated beams will open another can of worms in the future maintenance of the beams. Hiring the professionals was a great move! Not only did they finish in only three days, but they also patched and repaired our wall issues. I think it will look great with our new carpet. Thank you, Bill Morris, Paul Carmouche and John Danckaert, for overseeing this project. See below for a recap and photos.

The Board of Directors along with the Sinners have approved funding to upgrade wiring, switches, cameras and tv's for the arena and warm room. Much of the project will be completed prior to the start of the season but due to supply chain issues, the cameras will most likely be installed at the beginning of next season. Our Technology Committee is doing a great job managing this huge project and I'm looking forward to the finished product.

Ice Maker-

The latest Head Ice Technician contract expired at the end of the 2021–2022 season. We used this expiration as an opportunity to update the Head Ice Tech position and job responsibilities. This reassessment of the job description was based on member feedback, club needs, and new requirements over the past few years. The Head Ice Technician is a paid employee of the DCC with the elected representative Board of Directors as his or her de facto employer. Due to that relationship, the board has kept discussions about employment-related items confidential until it is appropriate to disclose the information to our members. With that said, the Board and Ice Committee are currently in the process of filling the position. In the event that the hire is not made by the time the season starts, we have contingency plans in place that would still allow us to start the season on time. While we still expect to be able to hire a great candidate, the ice installation has always relied heavily on volunteer efforts. This year will be no different, in fact, we may need to lean more heavily on our support base than normal. We are confident in starting the season on time no matter the outcome and will continue to try and do our very best for the club.

Ice Installation-

As mentioned above, we will need your help with ice installation. We are working with the city for early access to the club, but they are currently using their storage area and arena for offices, storage and equipment while they move city offices. Also, the Fall Festival is October 1 and they will need at least three days to clean up afterwards. We have a check-in scheduled for October 5. If all goes well, we will be able to take over the weekend of the 8th. If this doesn't work out, we will for sure have the building back by the 14th per our lease agreement. I realize this is tight timing to ask for help but please be on the lookout for a call for volunteers soon after the 5th. If you have questions contact Bill Morris at wcmorris1969@gmail.com.

This will give Bill Morris time to run reports and prep for the drawmasters meeting on October 20, 2022.

Rental Dates to Open-

The Rental Calendar will be posted on the public site by **October 7th**. It will be open for member priority registrations on that day. The Rental Calendar will be open to the public starting on **October 14th**. Rentals are a great way to spread the love of curling. Be sure to share the calendar with your friends and coworkers. I have been working to update our public website. I'm also developing a plan for future updates and assigning responsibilities for copy so we can stay current as we move forward. The Ice Rentals page will have one more round of revisions and the Events/Bonspiels will be updated as information becomes available from the Bonspiel Chairs. 

Level 2 Instructor Course—Detroit CC, 10/29/22

<u>Register</u> for the Level 2 Instructor Course on October 29th, 2022, at the Detroit Curling Club in Ferndale, MI. The course will run from 9 AM to 6 PM and is \$75 per person. The course will be led by Bret Jackson.

Before you arrive on October 29th, please ensure the following:

1) You have been a certified Level 1 Instructor for a minimum of one year.

2) You have met the basic online First Aid course requirement. If you have not done so already, please upload the certification in your MyUSACurling profile. Choose Qualifications from the dropdown menu located in the upper right of your Profile to add it. If you have First Aid certification through another activity, you can simply upload the documents without needing to take another course.

3) Your required SafeSport training is current. You can see your status and access the training from your MyUSACurling profile—you'll find a link to Center for SafeSport Training on the left side of the profile page. Click on Add Center for SafeSport Training to get certified or if you need to take a Refresher course.

If these requirements are met in advance of the course, you will receive your official Level 2 Instructor patch upon successful completion of the training on October 29th.




