
Men's International Recap

Club Mixed Championship Recap



Quebec International Bonspiel Review

The 108th edition of the Quebec International Bonspiel took place over January 21st thru January 25th with 62 teams from across Canada, United States, Switzerland, and France and at least a 5-game guarantee. All teams were placed into 4 team pools for pool play and based on their win/loss record, points scored, and ends won determined what events teams what eventually playdown for the championship. Given the number of teams playing, there are three clubs that provide their ice for the bonspiel: Club de Curling Etchemin, Club de Curling Victoria, and Club de Curling Jacques-Cartier. Each has their own uniqueness in terms of amount of curl, speed, and perhaps most notably, how loud the arena echoes.



This edition was quite special beyond it was the first time back since 2020. This was the first time the bonspiel changed from an only men's format to open. Detroit's team of Julie Benson, Jillian Riecke (Traverse City CC), Stephanie Whitmore, and Kristine Rathke were the first all-women's team to ever register for the bonspiel.





Michael Yanska, Bill Morris, Nate Glitman, and Dennis Pellerin went 3-0 in pool play and were placed in the A Event. They won their first game against a hearty group of ladies from Leaside Curling Club but lost in the A semi-finals against a team from Ottawa who ended taking 2nd overall for the whole event. They exited with a 4-1 record.

Ben Levy and Jenny Levy teamed up with Scott Piroth and Matt Smith from Bowling Green and started with quite a bang in pool play. Going 2-1 but with a sizeable point lead, they were placed into the B Event. Sharing the same fate, they won their first game but lost in the semifinals of the B exiting with a 3-2 record.

Chuck Thomas Jr, Paul Szmigiel, Joe George, and Paul Gaines had a mix in pool play and were placed in the F event. They won their first game but lost in the semifinals.

Team Benson also saw a mix in pool play and were placed on the other side of the bracket in the F event. They went on to win two in a row to make it to the F finals and taking runners up. They also take claim to be the first all ladies team to make it to a final.

There are too many stories, laughs, and camaraderie that this article just can't detail out. However, if you are ever curious about experiencing the Quebec International Bonspiel, talk to any Detroit member that went this year. You'll get a quick rundown on what one of the best of spiels in North America is all about and hopefully have you consider joining in for 109th edition in January 2024.



Percy J. Power

The Original Sinner - The First Deacon - The Head of the Kitchen Staff


"*All Sinners come home*" – come home and hear the story of the man that started it all. This is a story that every new Sinner must hear, remember and respect.

"To forget our past we lose the tiller toward our future"

Thomas Williamson founder of The Detroit Curling Club 1885.

Percy John Power was born 16 May 1897, the only child of John Power and Martha Hendryx in Farmington, Michigan. John Power led an interesting life as an Actor, a Civil War Veteran, a Sailor, an insurance executive and the Treasurer of Oakland County.

Percy graduated Northwestern High School in Detroit with honors and went on to acquire his law degree at Michigan. He set up his law practice in Detroit. In 1919 he married Mildred Cumner but divorced in October 1920. Mildred gave birth to their son Jordan in November 1920 and she moved back to Massachusetts with her son. Percy remained a bachelor the rest of his life. Percy served our country twice: in WWI as a Seaman 2nd Class and in WWII in the US Army Judge Advocate General's Corps (JAG).

He joined The Detroit Curling Club in October 1930. His first committee assignment was in 1933 on the "Ladies' Night" Committee. During his tenure he improved the food selection for the Ladies and lowered the prices. January 1934 saw Percy join the DCC Board of Directors. Percy continued to climb "through the chairs": 1934-35 he was Secretary; 1935-36 he was head of House & Kitchen; 1936-37 President.

He was very well connected to the politics and people who ran the City of Detroit. During the 1935 Kitchener Exchange in Detroit, Percy arranged for the Detroit Mayor Frank Couzens and a number of judges to attend the Kitchener Exchange Banquet. It should be mentioned that Mayor Couzens' wife was from Kitchener and they visited her relatives often in Kitchener.

During the mid-1930s The Club and the ice was not used on Sunday mornings. Legend has it that Percy and a few trusted friends armed with ham & eggs and other breakfast fixin's made their own Sunday morning breakfast and then curled a game or two.

Thus began the Sinner's Sunday Bonspiel in the late 1930s. The curling was publicized throughout the Club but the breakfast was kept quiet for many years. But, like all good things the word spread and more men appeared early on Sunday mornings. Percy, being an innovative type, permitted others to attend, but by his rules. To become a Sinner, one must attend three consecutive meetings and bring a "jug". The donated jugs were raffled off to help raise funds.

Guests of the members were welcome, but it was discovered that the number of hogged-rocks increased. So, Percy built (or had built) a life-sized Gloucestershire hog containing a bank on top and a bell on the tail. If a curler had a lapse in skill and hogged a rock, he must approach the hog, bow at the waste, ring the bell, deposit two-bits and vow never to hog a rock again.



As with many curling functions, not many records were made in these early days. But, by November 1940 these Sunday morning gatherings were firmly established in the Club's calendar.

The highest honor bestowed a Sinner is to be appointed to the Kitchen Crew. To a man, each member of this crew is a specialist at his job. Each week this elite group fixes a breakfast fit for a healthy appetite: Scrambled eggs, bacon, sausage, potatoes, mushrooms, toast and coffee – an unchanging menu for years. Some weeks the turnout has exceeded one hundred quests, but never has anyone left hungry. The Sinners provide a "deacon", a sermon, penalties for the wicked, rewards for the pure of heart and invariably a choir to sing the Sinner's Hymn: "Gently and Tenderly."

At the conclusion of the services, the men disperse: some to curl; some to cards; some to chat and others to "plateglass" skip the games. The Sinners are a great display of pure friendship that our game encourages.

The proceeds from the breakfast and the raffles sustain the organization. At the end of the season the Sinners donate a substantial amount of funds to the Club's general fund, only keeping seed-money for the following year.



When Percy died in 1975 he was one of only a few members whose estate bestowed a sizeable amount of money to The Club. In his honor at the "new" West Bloomfield facility an alcove off of the main room was named for him. This room served as the Trophy room and the Board of Directors meeting room.

At your next Sinner's Meeting, as you walk by the Percy Power Trophy Room, tip your hat and say a thank you to the Original Sinner.

"I'll have more eggs and pass the marmalade."
