Outgoing Canadian Sr. Friendship Tour Applications Due December 15

After successfully hosting two incoming tours in 2022, its time for US Curlers to travel to Quebec and Ontario Canada as part of the Sr. Friendship Tour. Eligible women must be 50+ years of age and any USWCA female curler is eligible to apply. Tour dates are November 3-14, 2024 (subject to change. **The application deadline is December 15, 2023.** Participants are selected on a lottery basis with equal representation from each of the four USWCA regions. Participants will be drawn at the National Bonspiel in February, 2024. The approximate cost of the tour is \$2,000-\$2,400, not including transportation to the start/end sites, some meals and incidentals. Ice Crew

We are creating a contact list for those who can help with the ice and who want to continue to learn to help with the ice. We have events that are coming up and need some coverage. We need your help to keep the ice quality and frequency of preparation up to our standards and expectations. One of the goals of Q being here is to build a strong support crew for the ice. This is a job that can go much better with trained helpers than alone. If you are interested or have questions, please email ice@detroitcurling.com and let Q know. He will be happy to talk you through the process and expectations. We scrape six days a week on average, and some days twice a day. Bonspiel season in Detroit is coming soon and we need our strong crew in place to ensure successful events.

Curling Etiquette

Here are a few tips on curling etiquette -

- 1. Walk along the sidelines and not in the middle of the sheet. Go to the sideline as soon as you're able to allow the opposing team to see the signal from their skip.
- 2. If your opponent is delivering, stay still until they release the stone.
- 3. Do not cheer your opponent's misfortunes, but instead celebrate their great shots.
- 4. Do not stand behind the house if you are not the skip or vice. If you find yourself stuck there for some reason, remain still, and keep your broom at your side.
- 5. When you are ready to deliver, go for it! There is no reason to wait for the person next to you.
- 6. Vices decide scoring and will measure rocks, if necessary. While it is exciting to know the score of the end, especially during a measure, it slows down the game trying to navigate the scoring and measuring while others are in the house.

NO-TICK SHOT Rule

The Detroit Curling Club would like the membership to be aware of the WCF/USA Curling no tick shot rule.

If, prior to the delivery of the sixth stone of an end, a delivered stone causes either directly or indirectly, an opposition stone in the Free Guard Zone (FGZ) which is touching the center line to be moved to an off-center line position or to a position outside the FGZ, the non-offending team has the option to:

(*i*) Remove the delivered stone from play, and replace all stones that were displaced to their positions prior to the violation taking place; or

(ii) Leave all stones where they came to rest. If the stone is moved from the center line to an out-of-play position, then the FGZ rule R6(b) applies.

This does not apply for Wheelchair Curling or for Mixed Doubles competitions.

The club is not currently adopting the rule for league play. If you are interested in playing by this rule, skips should discuss the rule before the game to reach an agreement. You may also talk to the drawmaster if your league would like to adopt the rule for your games. In general, we will strive to stay in alignment with the guidelines of the USCA. The USCA currently leaves the adoption of the no-tick rule for league play up to individual clubs. It is in effect for many competitive events and will become more common going forward.

Rentals

* Late Night Rentals

One change the Rentals Team implemented this season was to restrict the **7:30 pm - 10:00 pm Rental Time** to **DCC Members Only**. This was done because we regularly had alcohol-related issues from public rentals at this time slot. There have been 2 challenges with this.) There are very few bookings for the time by members (and this is traditionally a very popular rental time). 2) Some members have interpreted the "**DCC Members Only**" as they cannot include non-members to their rental.

This time period can be freely booked by DCC members and they can include non-members for their rental.

To increase our rentals in this time period, Rentals will be testing a way to allow the public to rent at this time and comply with our non-member alcohol restrictions. Throughout December, any public renter looking to book this time period will be able to with approval from the Rentals Director. As a member, if you want to rent this time slot, then I recommend booking it soon, as the public will be able to request this time. The goal is to ensure we maintain a safe and manageable environment for instructors to work in and for renters to enjoy the opportunity to experience curling safely.

* Member Rental Bar Service Requests

As a reminder, bar service can be available for a member's rental, but you need to send an email to the **DCC Bar Manager** (dccbarmanager@gmail.com) providing the date and time of their rental and indicating you would like bar service at your rental. Indicating "Yes" at the time of your rental booking does not send this email for you. The requests should be made at least 2 weeks prior to your rental. The Bar Manager will do his best effort to get a bartender for your rental, but this is not guaranteed. If confirmed, the cost is \$80 and is paid at the bar at your rental. OCA Updates and Information

As the only US club in the OCA, we are able to compete in any OCA events that lead to a *Provencial Banner*. Not to say you couldn't compete in one leading to *the National Championship* but we're unable to compete in the Brier or the Scotties.

The OCA offers a number of different categories to compete for a Provencial Banner including:

- <u>Open/Men's/Women's Trillium Club Championship</u> (Location TBA, March 8-10, 2024)
 - Club level event with teams using local bonspiel events to earn points and advance to the Final. The top 16 teams of each gender qualify for the Provencial Championship. The season runs from November 1st through February 26th.
 - Teams must register in the Club Series *prior* to earning any points. Events have to be held in CurlON Member Facilities and not restricted by age, by invitation only, or inner-league/club based.



- Teams must declare a maximum of six players and must field 3 out of 6 in all games for events.
- Submit scores using an online form. The best 3 results will count towards official rankings.
- For more details, please see the <u>23-24 ON Competition Rules</u>
- <u>Four-Person Stick Championship</u> (Palmerston Curling Club, February 9-11, 2024)
 - All participants must use the stick delivery system and be over the age of eighteen. Teams automatically qualify for the round robin pool play at the Championship. Open format. More rules can be found here.
- Grandmasters Championship (Thornhill Club, March 14-16, 2024)
 - Four event format with a three-game guarantee. Open to male athletes 70 and over and female athletes 65 and over as of February 28th, 2024.
 - Open Qualifiers will take place November 17-December 12 with <u>host sites currently TBA</u>. Entry fee is \$235 CA with entries closing on November 6 at 9:30AM.
 - Each team will be composed of four or five women or four or five men or any combination of women or men playing on any team position. More rules can be found <u>here</u>.
- <u>Senior Mixed Championship</u> (Gananoque Curling Club, April 10-14, 2024)
 - \circ Teams must be comprised of four members (two males, two females). Male athletes must be aged fifty and over, female athletes forty-five and over as of June 30th, 2024.
 - Four open qualifier events over March 22-24, 2024 weekend. Registration is due by February 26th, 2024 at 9:30AM. Entry is \$260 CAN. More rules can be found <u>here</u>.
- <u>Silver Tankard</u> (Oshawa Curling Club, April 19-21, 2024)
 - This unique format requires a four person men's team and a four person women's team playing for a combined score to decide the results. (At the same site, usually on adjoining sheets.) All athletes must be aged eighteen or older by December 31^{st} , 2024.
 - There are eight (8) <u>qualifier events</u> over the April 5-7th weekend to qualify for the Provencial Championship. Entry is \$370 CAN and must be registered by March 11, 2024 at 9:30AM.

Interested parties looking to compete in any of these events must first register with <u>canada.curlng.io</u>. If you have any questions about any of these formats or anything else that the OCA offers, please feel to reach out to your representatives Jenny Levy or Nate Glitman. Good curling!

5 & Under Eligibility Rules –Included in the <u>2022-2023 USA Curling Rules of Curling & Competition</u> are the updated 5 & Under eligibility rules. Event Eligibility has been changed to be a curling season (July 1st to June 30th of the following year) rather than a calendar year (see page 32). Pro Shop Update

The Pro Shop pricing for grippers has changed slightly. Due to some communication errors the gripper pricing has been revised as follows. Tournament grippers are selling at \$15 each, Balance Plus grippers are selling at \$16 each, Goldline and Asham grippers are selling at \$19 each. These prices are discounted prices. We apologize for any confusion this may have caused, and for those that already purchased grippers, most likely you got extra savings. Trust us, we are not going to ask you to make up the difference.

Please note in recent SWH newsletters, the price of grippers was reported to be \$12. This is NOT the correct pricing. Again, we apologize for any confusion this may have caused.

Requesting Name Tags

If you are requesting a name tag, PLEASE PRINT YOUR NAME CLEARLY. Several of the last names written have been difficult to decipher what letters are being written. If we cannot determine what was intended, we will not order the name tag. Also, please indicate if you are a new member (your first name tag is free) or a current member requesting a replacement name tag. Current member name tags will be charged accordingly. Finally, if you are requesting a unique name tag, please indicate who is requesting it. Unique name tags will be charged to the party requesting the tag.

Use of Club Equipment

If you are a new member (or even if you are not) please refrain from using the club rental equipment (grippers, brooms, stabilizers, step-on sliders) as your personal gear. HOCKEY, SKATING AND CURLING - 1896

Winter is here. Time for 3 on-ice action packed sports: Hockey, Figure Skating and Curling.

"Two hockey teams have been formed at the Detroit Curling Club and practice will begin tomorrow night. The Canadian rules will be observed. Toward the end of the week a game will have the support of The Club and it is thought that it will become one of the most pleasant features of an evening at the rink. Improvements to the clubhouse will be made so that the spectators can witness the play from above.

"In the skating carnival at the rink last night Clayton Busch won the gentlemen's prize and Miss Jessie Parkinson that for ladies.

"Two of the club matches in curling were played yesterday afternoon, resulting in wins for Skips Baxter and Cooney."

Reprinted from the Detroit Free Press December 27, 1896. This was thirty years *before* the Red Wings were formed. At least they curled a game or two before the ice skating & hockey!!!

Clean Ice

It takes a village to keep our ice clean. Here are some tips from our Ice Committee to keep the ice clean: **Clothes** - change at the club and utilize our lint rollers. Lint rollers and refills are available in both locker rooms and by both doors into the arena. There are more refills in the Sprinkler Room, so if you see one is empty, please swap it out. **Grippers** - grippers are on sale in the Pro Shop, \$2 off! Treat yourself to a new gripper and help keep the ice clean. **Broom heads** - It's also a great time to get a new broom head. Replace them regularly (at least 1-2 times a season per league, but more often is encouraged for cleanliness and effectiveness. The more you play the more they wear). When wiping them off after sweeping during a game, ONLY do this off the ice and over a garbage can.

Housekeeping

If you or your league host a meal, potluck, or party, please remember to clean up after yourselves including washing all dishes and putting away/taking home all food items. This is not the responsibility of the bar staff. The Rockettes purchased two new cordless vacuums. They are lightweight and very easy to use. If you see a rug that could use some cleaning, please grab one of these new vacuums and put it to good use. They are currently located in the front of the warm room - by the broom box and by The Percy Power Room.

Bar Tabs

Take a few minutes with the bartenders to check your credit card that is on file to make sure it's not expired or is the card you want to use. If you need to register a new card, see Derek or Frank for the paperwork.


Wausau Highlanders Women's Bonspiel, January 12-14, 2024 in Wausau, WI. We've


