## Ice maintenance break 2.0

During the most recent Ice Maintenance break, Quentin and his ice crew made the following repairs and improvements:

- The cracked fitting removed and replaced. The pipes were under tension, so an additional support was added.
- The header behind sheet 4 has heaved and is causing a walkway lip. Subsequently, the lower support has lifted by some inches.
- About ten garbage cans of ice/scrapings were removed from the worst part of the high points of sheet 3. A combination of the powered hand planer and the scraper were used over two days to balance out the sheet. The ice crew managed to knock down almost 4mm of the 10 mm high peak, bringing it more in alignment with the area. Thanks to John Gaul, Dallas Schneider, and Dennis Pellerin for assisting with this work.

- The home end backboard was removed, so that the ice crew could install new brackets to allow movement so as not to twist the boards. Thanks to John Gaul and Ben Glotzhober for their work and planning. Eric Trytko helped reseal the boards for the flood.
- Dennis Pellerin helped flood.

- Senior Mixed Championship (Midland Curling Club, April 2-6, 2025) Teams must be comprised of four members (two males, two females). Male athletes must be aged fifty (50) and over, female athletes forty-five (45) and over as of June 30th, 2024.
- Silver Tankard (Oshawa Golf & Curling Club, April 11-23, 2025) This unique format requires a four-person men's team and a four-person women's team playing for a combined score to decide the results. (At the same site, usually on adjoining sheets.) All athletes must be aged eighteen or older by December 31st, 2024.

If you order from Steve's or Goldline directly, you will incur these costs on top of the price of the equipment. In addition, a portion of each sale also goes back to the DCC!!! ## **Goldline Impact Broom Head Defect**

Goldline has informed us about a manufacturing defect affecting only the batch of Impact heads produced in 06/2022. If you have one of these brooms, check your batch number and confirm it is 06/2022.

## Angus MacTavish is in the House



### The All-American Bonspiel 1944-1946

The Men's International Bonspiel was not held for a couple of years during WWII because the Canadian curlers could not easily cross the border. At some point in 1943 it was decided to host an event comprised of all US rinks. As the *Scots Wha Hae* reported: "...hoping to get rinks from St. Paul, Utica, New York, Boston, Milwaukee and other points East & West."

The *Detroit Evening Times* reported on February 6, 1944, that the Honorable John Bracken, former premier of Manitoba and leader of the progressive Conservative Party in the Canadian parliament, would attend and skip one game on Friday on the Detroit rink of Fred Ferrari (General Chairman of the bonspiel). (Note: The provincial premier is the prime minister of the Canadian province. This title was used to distinguish the position from the Prime Minister of Canada.)

The 1st All-American featured 16 rinks with 7 from outside Michigan (Winnetka, Portage, St. Paul, Wauwatosa, Milwaukee). A special 1-inch souvenir pin was struck for the event – you can find a few in the pin collections hanging in The Club. Pictured below is a pin from the 1945 event.



The Detroit curlers were not the most gracious of hosts – four Detroit rinks advanced to the finals. The Detroit team of Nate Cornwall won this inaugural event. During the awards ceremony, the Honorable John Bracken expressed his gratitude for being able to participate and **promised to supply a cup for the bonspiel.**

The 2<sup>nd</sup> All-American Bonspiel was held in February 1945 and consisted of 24 rinks representing 10 clubs from 4 states and 3 Canadian provinces including a rink from Prince Edward Island which travelled 1,000 air-miles to attend. There were 8 Detroit rinks. Again, the "All-American" became the "All-Detroit" as the local boys dominated the event with 2 hometown rinks in the main event final game. The spiel was won by the Lou Hyde rink of Detroit.

Historically more significant than the actual competition this year were the meetings and presentations taking place off the ice. Members of The Detroit Club made presentations to representatives of the visiting USA clubs about the merits of forming a regional curling association – *The Midwest Curling Association*. The idea was approved, and the *Midwest Curling Association* was born. In time, the *MCA* would morph into the *USCA*.



The All-American Trophy Donated to The Club by the Honorable John Bracken, former premier of Manitoba

The 3rd All-American Bonspiel was held on the weekend of December 6, 1945. Twenty-four teams signed up for the competition. Unfortunately for the Wauwatosa rink their airplane was grounded in Milwaukee, and they missed the 1<sup>st</sup> draw.

The final game of the main event saw the Walter Polski rink from Virginia, Minnesota, against the Detroit team skipped by Dr. Hap L'Heureux. The Detroit rink moved into a 7-1 lead in the early stages of the match, only to see the Minnesotans score 6 unanswered points to tie the game 7-7. They went on to win the match and therefore the bonspiel.

Apparently, the winning rink was allowed to carry the trophy home. We can only assume that they had promised to bring it back the following year. Unfortunately, the All-American Bonspiel was never held again, and the trophy was not returned. It slowly faded from memory.

In late 2024 The Club received a message from a lady in Minnesota who had acquired the trophy and asked if The Club would be interested in reacquiring it. The Club's Board approved a plan to acquire the old hunk of metal, and the trophy is now back home where it belongs.

Currently, there are no plans to revitalize the All-American Bonspiel and no plans to repurpose the newfound trophy. We are just glad to have it back home where it belongs. Thank you to all involved in bringing it home. If you are ever in Sarnia look for the **Russell House Trophy**. It belongs to DCC Men's International but somehow became repurposed in Sarnia as a trophy for their Golf & Curl Mixed Spiel.
