Curling Coach

Do you measure up?

There are 4 measurement devices that are used at the club. Do you know the 4 devices and how to use them properly? Here is a quick explanation for each one.

- 1. Laser measuring device (LMD):** This device is designed to measure how close the center of a curling stone is to the pin. Normally, the LMD is used for Last Stone Draw (LSD) or Draw Shot Challenge (DSC) to determine which team will have hammer to start the game. The LMD requires the use of the app, Curl Distance, to calculate the actual distances of the stones to the pin. The LMD doesn't have much use at the club level for league play, it's better to use a tape measure if a draw to the button is needed.
- 2. T Square:** This device is only used on straight lines. The center line to determine if a guard is on or off the center line, or on the hog line, sideline, or back line to determine if a stone is in play. This is done by placing the lip against the ice and using the straight edge as a reference.
- 3. Biter Bar:** This device has 2 uses. One is to determine if a stone is in the free guard zone, any time before the 6 th rock is thrown. The second is at the conclusion of an end to see if a stone is in the house. Proper use of this device is important. Always place the biter bar on the ice behind the hack for a few seconds to cool the feet and the point. When placing the bar in the house, put the feet down first, then place the point into the pin. Always move the bar clockwise around the house and never lose control of the bar. Slowly move it past the rock that is being measured, any friction between the bar and the stone means the stone is in the house.

4. The Dial Measure or The Stick: This device is used to determine which rock is closest to the pin at the conclusion of an end. Like with the biter bar, set the dial measure behind the hack on the ice to cool the feet and point. When placing the device into the house, put the feet down first then the point into the pin, this protects the integrity of the pin. Rotate the device clockwise over the first stone to measure, slide the dial gauge towards the stone so the needle defects 2 or 3 full numbers. Then, rotate the device counterclockwise so it's no longer over the stone, and lock the gauge in place. To measure the stones, start rotating the device clockwise slowly past all the stones. Don't stop and don't go back and forth on a stone. Whichever stone moves the gauge more is the closest.

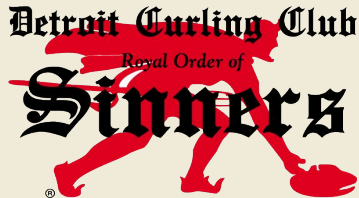

Eligibility: Any individual, no matter age or gender, may apply for funding. The applicant must be a good standing member of the Detroit Curling Club. Social members are not eligible. The Detroit Curling Club was once an Auto Plant

May 15, 1913. Studebaker designates The Club as Plant #14. The Studebaker Corporation has leased the Detroit Curling Club building on Forest Avenue as a storage warehouse for radiators, coils, springs and other supplies. This is the fourteenth building that the Studebaker Corporation has acquired in the capital of automobiledom. This arrangement was only for the non-curling months, since we know there was curling in the building in the winter of 1913-14.
