Project AILSA – 2026 Summary

(Vote will happen at Annual Meeting - Please attend for full presentation)

What is Project AILSA (Activities to Improve and Level the Surface of the Arena)? Started in 2024, Project AILSA is a multi-phase effort to address critical issues with the curling arena floor. The project focuses on stabilizing the ice surface, improving drainage, and modernizing key infrastructure to deliver the conditions for world class curling ice.

Why This Matters Recent investigations confirm the arena floor is experiencing progressive deterioration. Left unaddressed, this could eventually lead to severe structural failure.

Contributing issues include:

- **Poor drainage:** Approximately 66% of the rink does not drain properly, causing water to pool and seep below the slab instead of flowing to the trench.
- **Expansion joint failure:** Caulking failure due to heaving creates visible gaps between the slab and surrounding apron allowing for water infiltration.
- **Cracking in the concrete slab:** Ongoing movement has led to structural cracks across the floor.
- **Drainage trench deterioration:** Erosion and gaps are allowing water to seep under the slab rather than exit the system.
- **Sub-slab water retention and ice lensing:** Water trapped beneath the surface freezes and expands, causing the floor to heave and shift. Inspection confirmed ice and standing water within the upper insulation layer.

Project AILSA – 2026 Summary continued...

What We've Done So Far

- Conducted ground penetrating radar (GPR) scans to identify subsurface anomalies.
- Opened sections of the floor to confirm water buildup and ice formation.
- Completed soil borings to 25 feet to assess ground conditions.
- Engaged rink engineering partners to validate root causes and design solutions. Findings indicate that water infiltration and inadequate drainage are key drivers of the current problems.

Proposed Solution

- Phase 1 – Floor Replacement (Target: October 2027) at an estimated cost of \$1.1M.
- Phase 2 – Mechanical System Upgrade (Target: ASAP as fundraising allows) at an estimated cost of \$800K.

What's Next:

- A membership vote is planned for June 2026.
- Project approval requires two-thirds support of A-level members
- If approved, Phase 1 will continue toward the 2027 construction target. Phase 2 will be covered by an ongoing capital campaign. Execution of this phase is variable based on fundraising performance and a secondary member vote.

Bottom Line The arena floor is no longer performing as intended and is showing clear signs of failure. Project AILSA provides an engineered solution to stabilize the arena and ensure a consistent curling experience for years to come. We need 2/3 A-member approval to proceed any further.

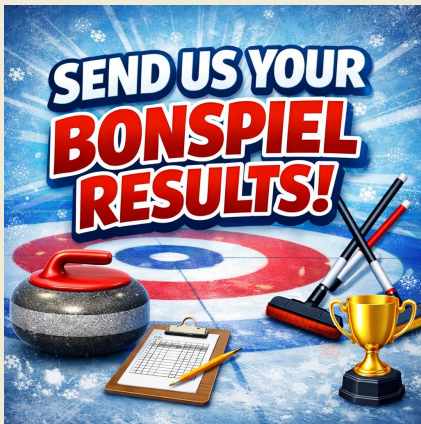

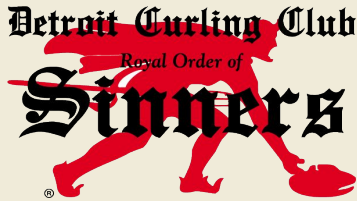
Most challenging part of your job: Trying to find ways for our members to connect and contribute to the Club in a way that is convenient and rewarding for them.

The Broom and The Bottle

In many older curling photographs from Europe, we see the use of a tee-marker. In Scotland they are called 'bottles'. In Switzerland they are called 'dollies'. Painting the circles is a comparatively recent custom. For a large part of the history of curling the curler played to a house which was only scored in the ice. It was difficult to see from the hack how the stones lay in relation to the tee.



The original way of reducing this difficulty was to mark the tee with a moveable object, known as the 'tee-marker'. This was usually made of wood so that if a stone were to come into contact with it, it did nothing to affect the running of the stone. The marker had to be small in cross-section so that it took up as little room as possible and high so that it could be seen above any stones that were lying near it. What better shape for this device than a bottle? Hence in many places the 'tee-marker' was known as 'the bottle'. We thank Bob Cowan for this information. You can read more at his curling blog.

As for curling push brooms or brushes...We have seen photographs from the 1800s in Scotland that clearly show curlers using brushes. "The Curler Companion" by W.H. Murray states: "It was during the 1922 tour that the Scots introduced the long-handled push-brush to North America". During this tour of Canada and The USA

the Scots visited The Detroit Curling Club in February 1923. We have photographs and newspaper articles around The Club that show the brush in use by the Scots.

The picture below was taken at The Detroit Curling Club during the 1949 Scots Tour. Note the HOG line marker on the wall...same ones we have today.



From personal experience, it was during the mid-1980s that the brush became popular with USA and Canadian curlers.




